

**A117****Moss-Sharman Research Collection/ Experimentation on Prisoners**

**Scope and Content:**

The Moss-Sherman Research Collection includes one binder containing articles, radio transcripts, correspondence, codes of conduct, and an inmate's rights handbook, related to prisoner experimentation.

One binder containing articles, radio transcripts, correspondence to correctional services Canada, Codes of Conduct, Inmates Rights Handbook as of 1982, and information involving government funded mind control torture, and experimentation. The booklet was compiled by Lynne Moss-Sharman, the contact for the Advocacy Committee for Human Experimentation Survivors -Mind Control. Its focus was to bring a reality to the experimentation in Canadian prisons, focusing on the boys of Thunder Bay. The booklet is a compilation of all the material published, collected and contributed since January 29, 1998. A large portion looks at the particular case of Robert Carlson, who claimed to be subject to CIA brainwashing experiments while prisoner between 1968-1974. The articles collected validate his claim.

**Biographical Sketch:**

Lynne Moss-Sharman, resident of Thunder Bay, prepared the material in this collection as part of a research project with the ACHES-MC (Advocacy Committee for Human Experimentation Survivors-Mind Control). She is the Canada contact for the ACHES-MC, which represented child survivors of CIA experimentation during the late 1940s, 1950s, 1960s. In 1977, she completed her fourth year Lakehead University social work placement at the Thunder Bay Shelter House.
