Scope and Content: The Thunder Bay Jazz Society fonds is a collection of correspondence, newsletters, public service announcements, questionnaires, information about artists and other records relating to the activities of the organization.

Organizational Sketch: The Thunder Bay Jazz Society was an organization founded in 1971 to create a greater appreciation of jazz. From 1971 to 1978 the society consisted of a "Big Band" which performed each Sunday at the Mary J.L. Black library. Beginning in 1978 membership in the society was opened to fans. In 1983 an executive was set up to run the society, and a newsletter began in 1984. By then its membership was up to 200. The society folded in 1986.
