Thunder Bay District Liquor Licence Inspector's Fonds

Original, 28 cm, 1887-1917.

Scope and Content:

Series G 7/1/1-4: Records, 13 cm, 1887-1917 (original).

The items in this collection are records of applications for liquor licence, fines levied by the Inspector and minutes of meetings of the District officials.

- 1) Letterbook of the liquor inspector for the Licence District of Port Arthur, 1899-1916 (923 p.script).
- 2) Minute Book of the Port Arthur Liquor Licence Commission, 1887-1917 (426 pp. used, script).

Biographical Sketch:

The Liquor Licence District of Port Arthur is a subdivision of the Licence District of Thunder Bay, and was created by an Order in Council approved by the Lieutenant Governor of Ontario on April 21, 1894. The Port Arthur Licence District included all the land lying north and east of the boundary line between Fort William and Port Arthur, and north and east of the boundary line between the townships of McIntyre and Neebing continued westerly; and all of the islands lying north of the boundary line continued easterly from the water's edge.

The Fort William Licence District is comprised of the remaining land south of the boundary lines and all island lying south of the said boundary lines easterly of the water's edge.
