These documents cover Seaman's efforts to patent and sell a trough bending design. Design diagrams, build specifications, and correspondence are present. Unfortunately for Mr. Seaman (and some associates whose level of involvement is not completely clear) new techniques were becoming common which prevented his invention from receiving much interest. It is unclear if a patent was ever approved or if Seaman had to drop the matter for lack of interest.
