Athalinda May Fitzpatrick was born July 20, 1907 of Mary Margaret Irwin and Watson Henry Fitzpatrick at Meldrum Bay, Manitoulin Island but moved with her family to Fort William the same year. She attended kindergarten at Francis Street School in 1912-13 at the age of 5.
