## **Thunder Bay District Scouts Canada Fonds**

Originals, 3.4 m, 1891-1999.

### **Scope and Content:**

The Thunder Bay District Scouts Canada Fonds is a collection of newspaper clippings and photocopies, biographical summaries, logbooks, minute books, cash books, and miscellanea relating to activities undertaken by local groups, and prominent individuals in the local scouting movement. Organized chronologically, or alphabetically, depending on record type.

# **Biographical Sketch:**

On July 15th, 1910, during a Y. M. C. A. organized camping excursion for boys interested in the scouting movement, the first two patrols of Boy Scouts in the Thunder Bay District came into being. While the scouting movement had been advertised and advocated locally before this date, little in the way of organizing a troop had been accomplished. The Scout's oath was administered, and a number of boys became either members of Eagle Patrol No.1 of Fort William, or Wolf Patrol No. 2 of Port Arthur.

In Fort William, a Scout Council was finally organized on December 12th, 1910, with Major E. R. Wayland presiding. Early troops to come under the jurisdiction of this council included the Wesley Boy Scouts, Westfort Boy Scouts (based at St. Thomas church), and the 3rd Fort William Boy Scouts (based at St. Paul's). Many more troops were to follow in the succeeding years.

Local troops followed the directions of the national organization, and to this end the 10th Fort William cubs admitted the first girl cub, Meghan Lewis, in March of 1992. In 1997, the City of Thunder Bay was the site of the Canadian Jamboree, and scouts from all corners of the country camped en masse at Boulevard Lake.
