Organizational Sketch: The Grand Trunk Pacific Railway was constructed by the Grand Trunk Railway using loans from the Canadian government. First sod was turned in 1905 by Prime Minister Laurier at Fort William. By 1919, GTR defaulted on the loans from the Canadian government and management was placed under the Crown corporation of Canadian National Railways. The bridge over the Kaministiquia was able to swing to allow river traffic to flow, but could also be secured to allow rail traffic. It is no longer in operation.
