Organizational Sketch

Kam Theatre was formed in 1974 as a Northwestern Ontario based professional theatre company which intended to tour other communities in the region which did not often experience live theatre. The company performed Canadian plays, commissioned original scripts and built collective creations. They often wove together mime, music, dance, circus skills with more traditional plays. The company's primary concern was the development of local talent. It was an incorporated body and a registered charity with funding from the Canada Council, the Ontario Arts Council, the City of Thunder Bay, private donations, and performance revenues. Kam Theatre disbanded in 1989.
