Organizational Sketch: The McKellar General Hospital Nurses Alumnae organization was founded in 1923 by Jane Hogarth in memory of the hospital superintendent, Isabel Johnstone, who died that June. The School of Nursing trained 850 nurses between 1904 and 1971 and they all became members of the Alumnae. The school was founded in 1904 and closed in 1971. The Alumnae is still operating.
