The association intended to improve health care by "acting as a patients advocate by assisting patients to get their grievances heard; advocating easier, simpler, and more equitable complaint procedures; and promoting among the public an awareness of their health rights and responsibilities." The association would help to inform patients of their rights, as well as give them advice and assistance regarding complaint procedures and grievances.
