All folders that do not fit well in previous categories. This includes welcome packages, minutes from board meetings, a large number of correspondence (mostly with performers or government), fundraising efforts, contact information, and other forms related to the running of the Summer Solstice Festival.

Administrative Sketch: The earliest beginnings of the festival date to 1970 when a group from Orenda Farms sought a new celebration as part of the pre-Christian spiritual revival of the mid-20th century. Gatherings were held in that rural location from 1970-1977, then, following an absence in 1978, it was decided to host a far larger event in Thunder Bay for 1979. The larger festival drew from the numerous contemporary Canadian folk festivals, and while it put emphasis on local talent it did draw performers from across the nation. The festival group continued to exist until at least 1987.
